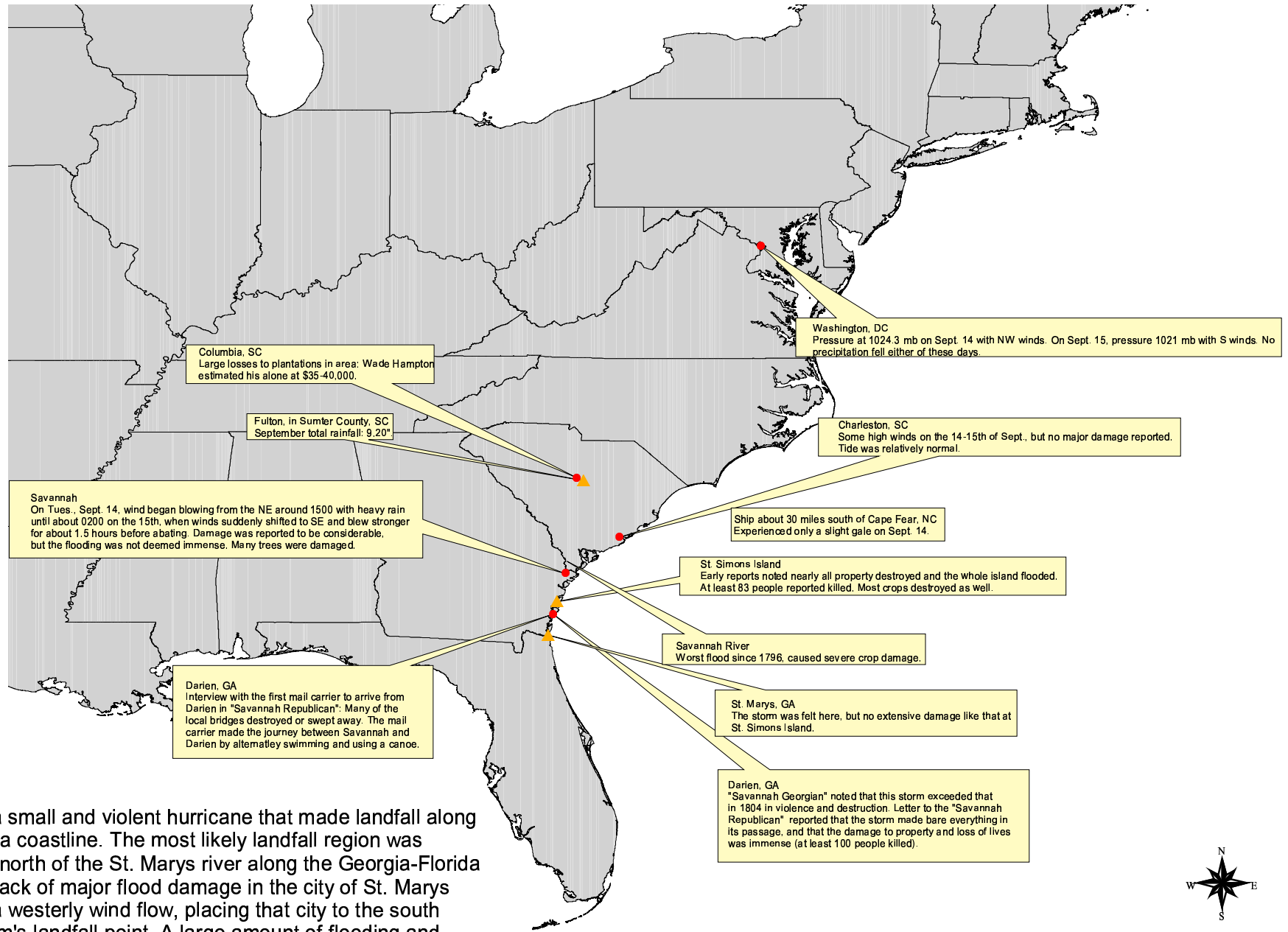


The Georgia Coastal Hurricane and Storm Tide of 1824 - Sept. 14-15



This was a small and violent hurricane that made landfall along the Georgia coastline. The most likely landfall region was just to the north of the St. Marys river along the Georgia-Florida border. A lack of major flood damage in the city of St. Marys indicates a westerly wind flow, placing that city to the south of the storm's landfall point. A large amount of flooding and damage was reported at inland areas. The track of the storm apparently took it northwestward near the Georgia-South Carolina border, and into the Southern Appalachian mountains.
