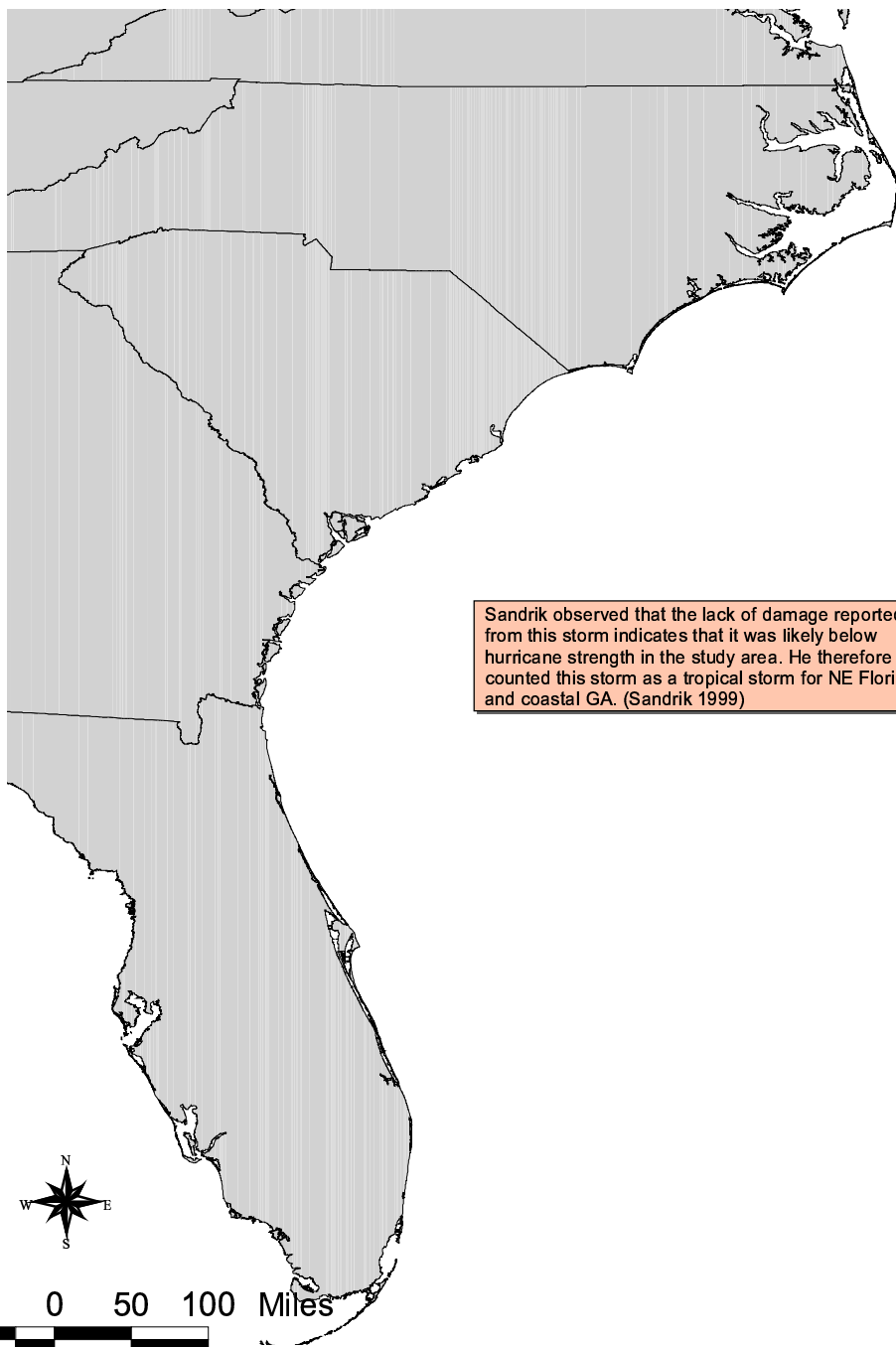


The Early June Hurricane of 1825 - I - June 2-4



Sandrik observed that the lack of damage reported from this storm indicates that it was likely below hurricane strength in the study area. He therefore counted this storm as a tropical storm for NE Florida and coastal GA. (Sandrik 1999)

This storm came out of the Caribbean to become one of the most prominent examples of an early-season mainland hurricane. Weather observations in St. Augustine indicate that the storm first approached from the S or SW, but actually passed to the E on June 3rd. Evidence from North Carolina places the track across the coastal sections of that state. Wind reports at Elizabeth City suggest that the center recurved seaward south of that city.
