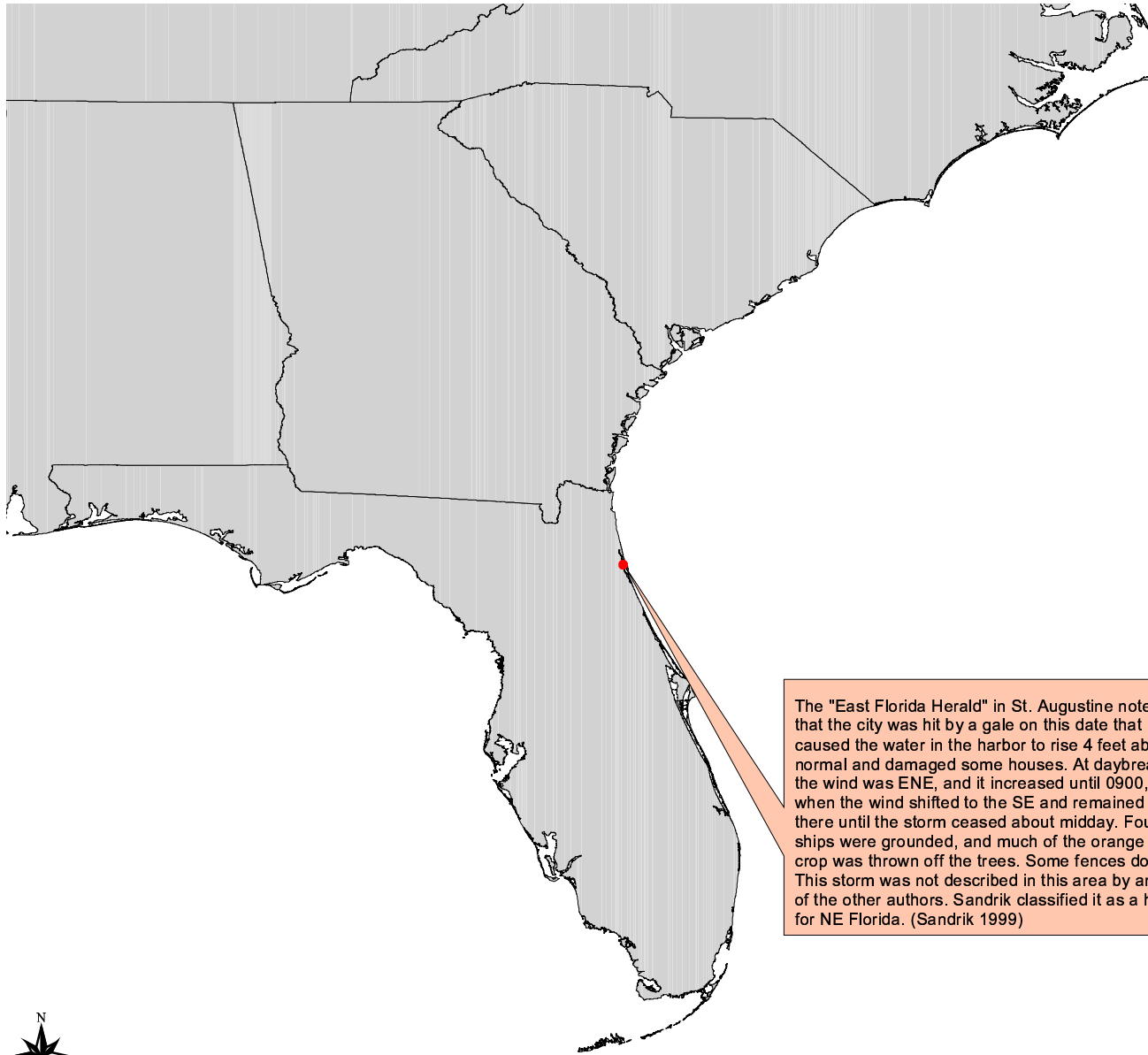


Storm 2 - Oct. 2



The "East Florida Herald" in St. Augustine noted that the city was hit by a gale on this date that caused the water in the harbor to rise 4 feet above normal and damaged some houses. At daybreak the wind was ENE, and it increased until 0900, when the wind shifted to the SE and remained there until the storm ceased about midday. Four ships were grounded, and much of the orange crop was thrown off the trees. Some fences down. This storm was not described in this area by any of the other authors. Sandrik classified it as a hurricane for NE Florida. (Sandrik 1999)
