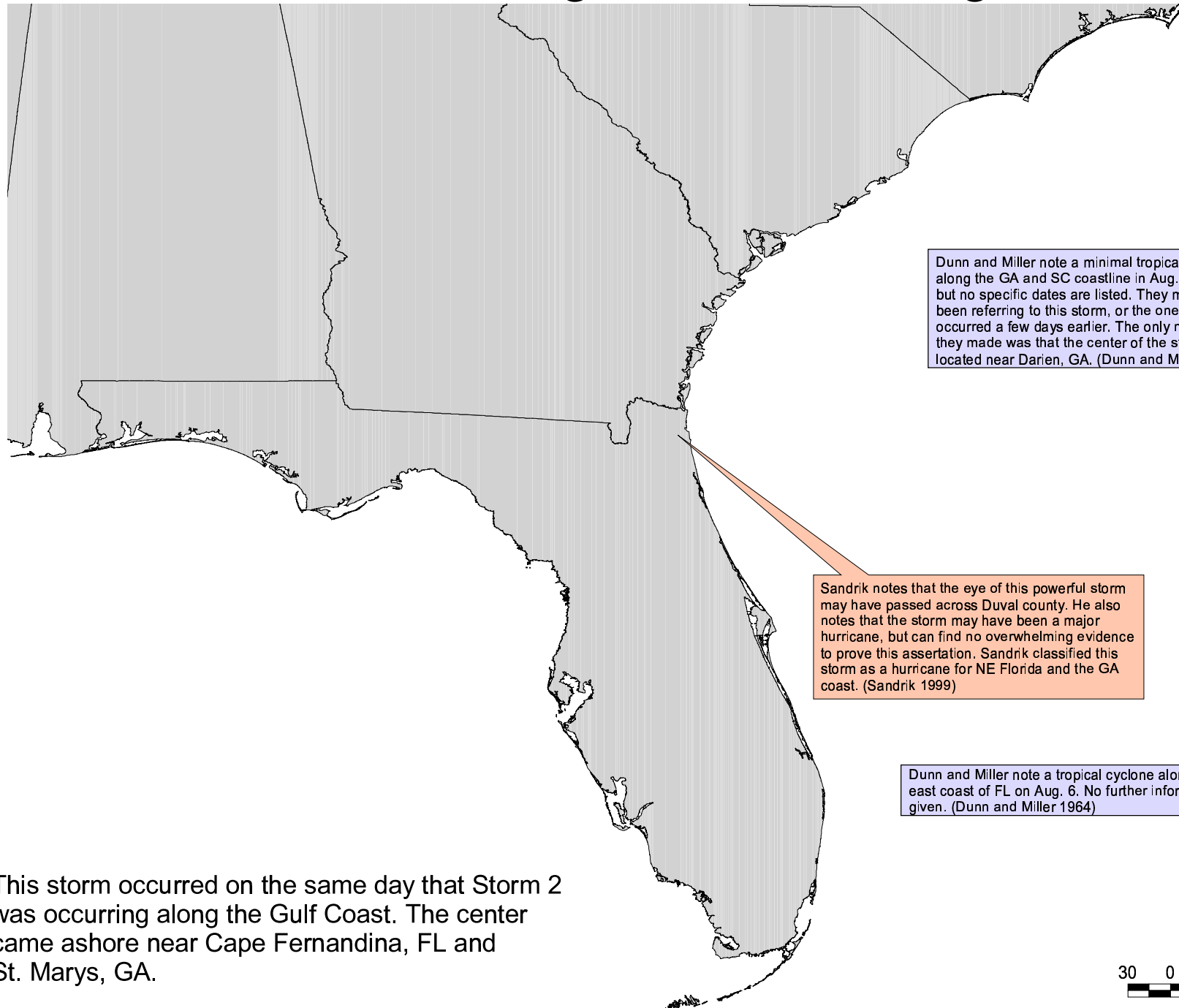


# 1837 - No. 3 - Antigua-Florida - Aug. 6-7



Dunn and Miller note a minimal tropical cyclone along the GA and SC coastline in Aug. 1837, but no specific dates are listed. They may have been referring to this storm, or the one that occurred a few days earlier. The only notation they made was that the center of the storm was located near Darien, GA. (Dunn and Miller 1964)

Sandrik notes that the eye of this powerful storm may have passed across Duval county. He also notes that the storm may have been a major hurricane, but can find no overwhelming evidence to prove this assertion. Sandrik classified this storm as a hurricane for NE Florida and the GA coast. (Sandrik 1999)

Dunn and Miller note a tropical cyclone along the east coast of FL on Aug. 6. No further information given. (Dunn and Miller 1964)

This storm occurred on the same day that Storm 2 was occurring along the Gulf Coast. The center came ashore near Cape Fernandina, FL and St. Marys, GA.
