Damage to buildings is near St. Augustine Two wharves completely destroyed. Inundation of up to 1 1/2 feet of water reported in the Post Office. Nearly all of the buildings in the twon blown down. Tampa Bay The center passed just north of Tampa Bay between 1300 and 1600 on Sept. 25. Lowest barometric pressure observed at Ft. Brooke was 954.2 mb. Most of the structures at the fort were destroyed by the high winds and storm surge. All the vessels in the port were driven up the river and grounded. The tide was estimated to have reached 14 feet above mean sea level. The storm moved ENE out over the Atlantic were several ships encountered it on the 25th and 26th.
