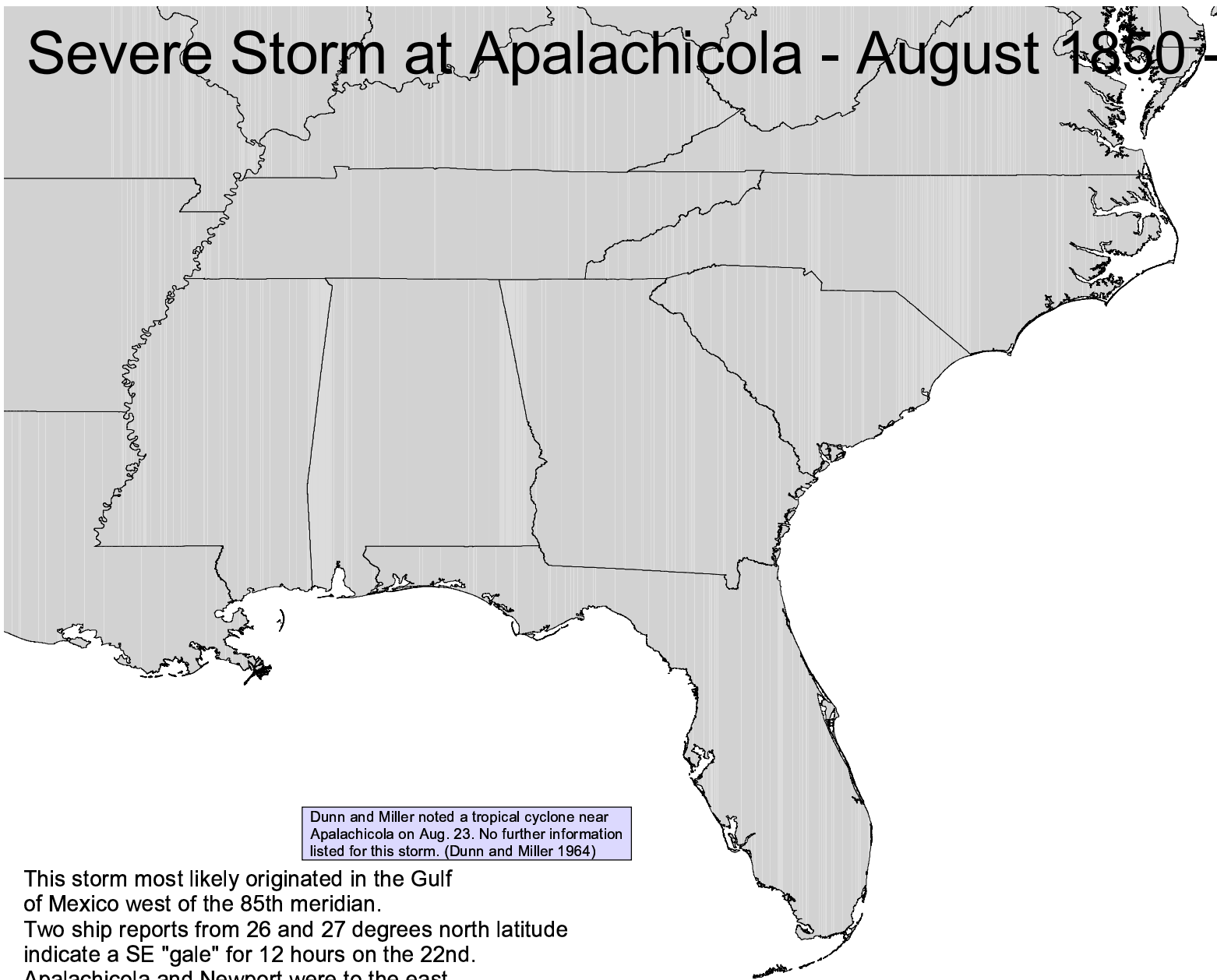


Severe Storm at Apalachicola - August 1850 - Pt. 1



Dunn and Miller noted a tropical cyclone near Apalachicola on Aug. 23. No further information listed for this storm. (Dunn and Miller 1964)

This storm most likely originated in the Gulf of Mexico west of the 85th meridian. Two ship reports from 26 and 27 degrees north latitude indicate a SE "gale" for 12 hours on the 22nd. Apalachicola and Newport were to the east of the storm's center based on their winds coming from an easterly direction. The storm possibly made landfall between Pensacola and Panama City with a N-NE track.
