Functional Requirements for Bibliographic Records: Final Report(1)

- 1. To provide a clearly defined, *structured framework* for relating the data recorded in bibliographic records to the *needs of users*
- 2. To recommend a basic level of *functionality* for records created by national bibliographic agencies
