Multi-Season Forecasts of North Atlantic Hurricane Activity: 2002–2007

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

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Singular spectrum analysis (SSA) applied to annual North Atlantic hurricane counts produces a set of filtered time records that capture the important modes of temporal hurricane variability. Details of the analysis are given in Elsner et al. (1999). Multivariate Poisson regression of annual counts on the filtered records generates a forecast probability distribution for the next season. This procedure is iteratively applied to make forecasts for six consecutive seasons.
