
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## ASSIGNMENT #1 Due Wednesday, January 8

Complete each short progression below (represent the missing chord with a Roman numeral and figure). Then write the correct key signature and realize the progression in keyboard style (three notes in the right hand, one note in the left hand). Notice that the first progression should include a <u>characteristic</u> melodic leap between the second and third chords, and the second progression should include a common and allowable irregular resolution of the chordal seventh.



Harmonize the short melody below in chorale style (i.e., assume each melodic note is a chord tone and generally write one chord per beat). Please restrict yourself to functional harmony, using only the chords we covered last semester (listed below; please assume that "I" also includes i, "ii" also includes ii°, and "IV" also includes iv).
